## Dago Irias Update

For those of you who have not been to La Ceiba yet, Dago is the pastor of the church in La Ceiba that partners with Total Health to run the clinic there. It is this church (Iglesia Gran Comision La Ceiba) that founded the clinic and none of what we do could be done without them. In November 2009 Dago fell and literally crushed his right elbow. By January, after a failed surgery in Honduras, it was clear his injury

could not be managed there. His arm had become swollen, discolored, and he had virtually no movement in the shoulder, elbow, or hand. Thanks to Dr. Joe Mileti, Dr. Jim Latshaw, and Dr. Dave Robie at the Ohio Orthopedic Center of Excellence and the generosity of Riverside Methodist Hospital in Columbus, OH, Dago had a successful surgery to rebuild his right elbow on February 2, 2010. He returned to

Honduras April 21. His arm is dramatically better and he is using it every day. He will continue his physical therapy at home. Special thanks to Erica Ream for providing his physical therapy in Columbus and his therapy regimen for home. Thanks to everyone for all of the prayers and support as Dago recovers from this injury.
