



El Salvador – New Clinic Opening

In early 2012 we began exploring the possibility of adding additional Total Health sites in Central America. It always amazes me that when the timing is right, all the pieces of the plan seem to simply fall into place. Accordingly, we are thrilled to announce the upcoming opening of our clinic in Guayabo, El Salvador. Guayabo is a village just outside of San Salvador that will service as many as 30,000 within walking distance.

Similar to the model of our existing clinics in Honduras and Nicaragua, the El Salvador clinic is situated adjacent to other established facilities constructed as part of a larger plan to help those in need in Guayabo and the surrounding areas. Total Health will provide the basic primary medical care and there are also programs to help with nutrition, education and spiritual care. As these programs grow and work together we can empower those we serve to improve their lives and their futures.

This clinic could not be made possible without the the various partners that have stepped up to make this a reality. We are

extremely excited to be partnering with organizations that share our passion and desire to help those less fortunate.

We are very please to be partnering with **Rock City Church** in Columbus, Ohio in order to bring this clinic to reality. While new to Total Health, Rock City is not at all new to Central America and the needs of the communities. They have been working with and serving the San Salvador community in various ways over the past year.

But the people we serve in Central America are

all very poor, yet they are willing to give and to serve those around them. It has given me a passion to serve, even in my local community.

If you go, recognize that you will be used to make a difference. Things will most likely not go as you expected, so a high degree of flexibility is needed. Be prepared for spontaneous adventures, but also be prepared for an unbelievable experience that will change you in good ways that you never thought possible.
