Several homes were provided to families previously living in shanty make-shift houses. One of these homes, generously funded and constructed by a Total Health mission team from Christian Assembly in Columbus, Ohio was **home number 100!**

Our partnership with Akron Childrens Medical Center expanded, adding to the care provided in Latin America while providing valuable global experience to U.S. based healthcare providers.

And if the year was not full enough, we are ready to open **the fourth Total Health clinic** located in Soyapango, El Salvador. The clinic will begin seeing patients later this month.

This is one of those years

that we look back on and wonder where the time went and how did everything get done.

But we spend only a second or two reflecting on 2016, because we know future needs will continue to be great and 2017 is right around the corner. There are at least two new sites preparing and clamoring for a future clinic, a new physician assistants program is in the works with a local Ohio college, and we have already several mission teams scheduled. No time to live in the past, the future is coming at us very fast.

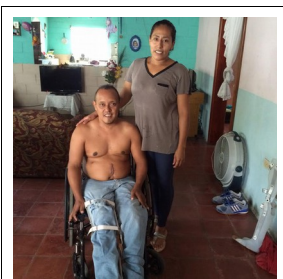

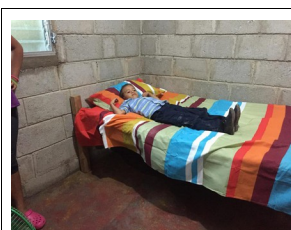


Survived the gangs

Your contributions are tax deductible and you will receive a document in early 2015 detailing all your contributions to Total Health for the year.

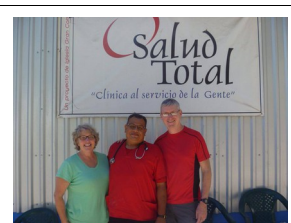
